Task Area English Fun Day (S.1 - S.3)

An English programme targeted at the average students to experience the joy of learning English and appreciate its relevance and usefulness in experiential learning

Implementation Plan

Location: Hong Kong landmarks and interesting facilities

Date & Time: Saturday: 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.Participants: One for S.1 and One for S.2 – S.3

No. of Classes: 2

Class size: 20 students, 2 school teachers, 1 NET Lesson duration: 7 hours per day per NET

Facilitators: One dynamic Native English-speaking teacher (NET)

Materials: Teaching resources

Focus: Fun day activities using English as a medium

Benefits Anticipated

The group of participants will experience the authentic use of English language with the specific themes and areas of studies. Students' interest in English language will be enhanced. They will do interviews with foreigners and present the findings after the observational activities. Their confidence in jotting notes and presenting ideas will be enhanced.

Implementation Schedule Oct 2019 to Dec 2019

Resources Required

Programme Fee - \$10,000 X 2 (including entry fee and coach fee)

Total - \$20,000

Proposal 2

Task Area S.1 and S.2 Readers' Theatre Workshop

An English programme targeted at the above-average students to enhance their interest in language arts and confidence in speaking.

Implementation Plan

- 1. 1 class of 8 90-minute sessions will be held on Saturday.
- 2. Class size: 20 students

Benefits Anticipated

The group of participants will have in-depth training in techniques of 'reading out loud' and confidence building. Reader's Theatre is prelude to full-blown drama. Students' interest in language arts will be enhanced. Students have a script to read from, receive guidance on how to read the script with the right pronunciation, stress, intonation, pause, volume and much more. A better examination performance is also expected in the oral examination.

Implementation Schedule: Oct 2019 to Dec 2019

The participants will polish their speaking skills by participating in discussion and exchanging ideas, which are enhanced by using appropriate language input.
